

JOTTINGS FROM A COUNTRY CHURCHYARD

WELL, HERE WE ARE in June and once again Lin and Peter have done a magnificent job in creating an edition of 5 Alive where there are none of the normal events to announce or report. But what amazing feats of enterprise people have achieved using modern technology creatively. As a techno dinosaur I can only dimly imagine Zoom and its variants but it seems incredibly effective in uniting people virtually.

However, I have found something which I find even more amazing. I have just gathered a bucketful of Queen Anne's Lace from the orchard before the ground is strimmed of that and the waist high ground elder which until now has rendered my dogs invisible when we walk there. I am writing this sitting on a bench beside the bucketful of blossom and for the first time I have really studied the flowers of the froth of white which currently flows over hedgerows and unmowed ground. Each single floret forming the flat umbels is like a tiny five-pointed snowflake, each precise five points bearing larger flowers surrounding five or seven smaller identical ones creating the delicate lace effect. And each umbel consists of exactly 10 of these florets. Such mathematical precision infinitely reproduced. And so each tiny seed in the many seed heads that mature is programmed to produce the same mathematical pattern. And we think computers are clever. Our Creator is always ahead of us by countless millions of years.

Amazingly V.E. Day did not go uncelebrated. Everyone seemed to find a way to mark the occasion in spite of the current restrictions. In Chantry churchyard, our enterprising Jan and Andrew announced a sing-along

of wartime songs between 3.00 and 4.00pm so that anyone taking their exercise hour could then join in, keeping social distancing. A lovely idea and much appreciated.

The churchyard at this time has progressed from the yellow of celandines and daffodils (and dandelions) to a carpet of blue. As well as the obvious bluebells since some of the areas are now left unmowed a wonderful variety of previously far less seen wild flowers have appeared, most of which are blue. There is a lovely area of parma violets as well as masses of the tiny wild ones among the grass, also ground ivy, vipers bugloss, speedwell and forget-me-nots all creating a drift of various shades of blue and purple. Later it will merge into pink with campion, herb robert and vetch. Wonderful. What a year for spring blossom it has been, too. An effusion of ornamental cherries, a positive explosion of wisteria and in the hedgerows blackthorn followed by hawthorn. The hawthorn or may was even flowering at the end of April.

With the unusually warm weather this would certainly have encouraged those who believed the rhyme referred to the May blossom to "cast a clout". In fact those who believe it to refer to the month of May would find it most uncomfortable not to "cast a clout" Sadly, the candles of blossom on the churchyard conker tree were fewer and smaller as the poor tree suffers from the predation of the nasty leaf eating moth larvae blighting so many of our horse chestnut

trees nationally. But it is such a perfectly positioned and huge beautifully proportioned tree that it still presented a heart liftingly lovely sight.

I hear from several people locally that they often see Red Kites flying over their gardens but until recently I just listened with envy. Then, last week, gazing up at the unbroken blue sky I saw the unmistakable silhouette of the Red Kite with its huge forked tail sailing high over my rooftop. I felt as if I had at last been admitted to a rather select club. I am still blessed with the presence nightly of our resident hedgehog, shuffling around at dusk until Frisky finds her/him and causes her/him to roll up into a spiky ball. I don't feed her/him as either the dogs would find any leftovers or, worse, local rats would be encouraged. It is a well known fact that in the country one is never more than six feet from a rat and in spite of the vigilant dogs I know this to be true. Not that either of my girls would kill a rat – more likely to run for cover if faced with one – but I hope their smell and busy presence keeps any rats at least away from the house.

We're very much open for business as usual our doors are not shut! We have quickly adapted our working practices and most consultations can be dealt with either by telephone or video link. If the doctor or nurse feels that a patient needs to attend the surgery, they will organise this and will see the patient whilst wearing the required PPE. The patient will also be asked to wear a face mask, which is provided when they attend the surgery. On Monday mornings we are holding a 'Restricted Surgery', these are for people who have been shielded. This means that the door is closed and we only allow in those who have a pre-arranged appointment. The doors reopen to all other general enquiries again at 2.00pm. All morning however the Reception telephone line remains open as normal.

The first ten minutes of any session always seem to be dealing with the technology; there will be conversations such as, "Mary, move your camera we can only see your feet," "We can't hear you John, turn on the mike", "Is that a cat in front of the camera?" Eventually things settle. Using a laptop, tablet or phone we can see others taking part in the event. If there is a teacher or speaker the screen can be arranged just to show them.

It felt pretty strange lying on the floor at home getting instructions from my Pilates teacher via my iPad, watching her demonstrate and hear her commenting to other members of the class in their homes. But after just a few weeks it feels almost normal and it's a very short commute! I couldn't work out how a Quaker meeting would work in this format, but it has been fine. Sitting in silence on your own at home is all very well but to be able to see others doing the same thing is encouraging and comforting As long as Friends remember to turn on the mike when moved to speak, all is well. We also have a time after to catch up with news and give out notices. I can't speak for the camera club but judging from the laughter and banter that I overhear I would say it's working well. I realise that this way of doing things is not for everyone, I have friends who really don't want to go down this path. But for me in these difficult times when it has been so easy to lose touch, using Zoom has helped me to feel connected to the different communities that I am a part of and also you get a glimpse inside everyone's homes - so now need to go and tidy up before my session this evening! 
CHANTRY

While there has been a fair number of people asking for help with the sort of important things I expected (shopping, getting prescriptions, Covid information etc), we have also had conversations about noisy motorcycles, punctured wheelbarrows, tadpoles, sourdough bread, kefir, fertiliser, horse manure, heating oil, gardening, pond plants, flowers, goldfish, herons, otters, geese, swallows, honey, broadband, Easter eggs, courgette seedlings, masks, paint rollers,

ducks, mains water, bonfires and cattle and offers like the one pictured left.

MellsMatters FaceBook page produced a large and immediate response from our younger residents who cheerfully took up the slack in the shop at a time of highly increased demand from locals who quickly cottoned on to the fact that village shops could supply necessities that supermarkets ran out of!

Jo in the cafe had to close to eat-in customers but did a good trade selling take-always until that too became unviable and the cafe morphed into a useful storeroom for extra supplies. Gradually it became apparent that more social distancing in the shop would be in order; Liz O'Sullivan kindly donated Perspex panels from her old greenhouse which were made up by Martin Moore into a serviceable screen for the counter. Eventually the counter had to be moved forward in front of the door so that one



person could be allowed into the shop at a time. The post office has no such problem as it is sited in a glass 'fortress'; it also continues to deliver much needed weekly postal services to the villages of Coleford, Falkland, Nunney, Wanstrow and Witham Friary.

Meanwhile the problem of self-isolating residents of all ages from the five villages has been enthusiastically taken up by younger volunteers buddying up with a stay-at-home householder who rings them up whenever they need supplies from the Shop. Deliveries arrive the same day and are paid for via a temporary account with MVS.

Now we feel that volunteers behind the counter should be distanced from post office staff passing behind them so the shop counter has been moved yet again into the cafe (with intercom communication with the post cffice counter). Martin Moore has cunningly created a counter and a screen with yet more of Liz's old greenhouse and customers seem to be getting the hang of having to wait outside the Shop until the customer before leaves the premises. During this crisis opening times can change, so please phone before visiting at the beginning or end of day.

The MVS Committee thanks Mike, Jerry and Helen for rallying round and working long and arduous hours under difficult conditions, all the volunteers who have magically stepped up to the plate just when they were really needed and our loyal customers who have been so understanding about unfamiliar working methods and shortages and so supportive In our attempts to keep our villages operational in this national emergency.

Notes from meeting held remotely via Zoom on Tuesday May 12th 2020 **Old Telephone Exchange**: The building appears to be occupied overnight. MDC are actively following up the situation. The situation has been ongoing for approximately five years. Concerns were raised that there is only a 10 year period between works being carried out and a planning application not being submitted, before Change of Use can be applied for.

Council Tax Support: Anyone currently claiming the support can now claim an extra £150. Applicants going onto Universal Credit can also make a claim for Council Tax Support.

Superfast broadband: Truespeed is keen to install in Mells and Vobster. Take up has been low so far but the recent lockdown restrictions have led to far more people working from home which may have highlighted the need for a faster, more reliable system. The next step is for Truespeed to canvass door to door but this cannot be carried out until social distancing restrictions have been relaxed.

Defibrillator: The Parish Council has agreed to take on responsibility, insurance and maintenance of the defibrillator which is currently stored in The Talbot. The unit will be installed in a suitable secure cabinet on the shop wall for 24 hour accessibility.

Condition of Vobster churchyard and Velux windows: Clerk has written to the PCC regarding the building debris and will investigate whether permission has been given for the Velux widows.
