In those days before television and social media, children were mainly shielded from the horror and reality of war. Consequently, it was a novelty and an adventure to sleep in our cellar at night with my special torch and one of my favourite soft toys – often a dog, never a doll. The cellar was snug and clean and shelved for storage while the door to the coal cellar room was firmly closed. It had electric light too, so it felt like a little underground house, fun to visit, with little regard for the menace in the skies above. I had a camp bed tucked under the shelving but the family only had armchairs. Oh dear! How did I get on to all that? Memories in the media recently of VE Day perhaps?

The May warmth has speeded up everything into flower so that the froth of blackthorn was almost overtaken by the cream lace of hawthorn. Birds, too, seemed not to know if they were coming or going. A friend said he had seen two swallows arrive on the same day that he had a redwing, who should have long departed, still on his lawn. Another keen bird enthusiast, who has a window overlooking feeding stations and bird baths, had noticed a robin regularly paddling in a saucer. Not bathing, just paddling. Perhaps he had been standing on hot flagstones or roof slates and needed to cool his feet? It's surprising what unusual bird behaviour one can spot if one has the time and patience to watch.

A really exciting bird seen last week by a local friend was an eagle. I confess to being a bit sceptical at first but he checked with the Hawk and Owl Trust at Weyhill to be told that the young white-tailed sea eagles which had been introduced to the Isle of Wight had been seen over Somerset. Later another friend saw a huge bird of prey lifting a

whole deer carcase which it dropped on being disturbed and didn't return although my friend waited hopefully.

But the day the village helpers were preparing then plant and cake sale in Chantry church and churchyard they were treated to an aerial display by the sea eagle being mobbed by crows and accompanied by local buzzards and kites who were probably reclaiming their air space but too cautious to do more than follow and observe. What a marvellous sight that must have been.

The following day while on duty all day at the plant sale I kept a hopeful eye on the sky but sadly saw nothing of note. But the same day, another "birdy" friend identified by song and sight a goldcrest in the churchyard. Amazingly largest and smallest birds seen in Chantry within 24 hours. How lucky we are! But watch out! "The eagle has landed." Do report any further sightings. Enjoy the summer! See you in July. *Hazell*
