The seemingly ever-increasing size of the prison population; the appalling conditions within many of our older prisons, especially those in our inner cities; the almost total lack of provision for education and rehabilitation and an apparent unwillingness by those elected to Parliament to

consider whether the whole of our justice system needs a radical overhaul have all resulted in much media comment. But one part of the prison system which has not been mentioned is the invaluable role played by those who serve as Chaplains. Prison and restorative justice have been a constant thread almost throughout the whole of my life beginning with my first visit while still in my teens to what was then called a Borstal.

Since then, I've had the privilege of working with chaplaincy teams across the whole of the prison estate. I've witnessed at first hand the extraordinary work done those teams, lay and ordained, of all faiths, working together to witness to God's love in Christ and caring for all those in the prison system, both staff and prisoners. I've often said to those on the outside, if you want to know what true collaborative ministry looks like in practice, look no further than a chaplaincy team. While each member remains true to his or her particular faith, the

barriers which often divide people of faith have no part in that shared work of witness and service.

Sadly, all too often, the work of Chaplaincies not just in prison but in all aspects of our human life, in education, hospital, mental health, care homes and many other places, is barely known – that is, until we need their care. But Chaplaincies are the yeast which leaven our society. The light which shines in the darkness. Society, as we long and pray for it to be, would be the poorer without them.

necessarily regular church attenders for various reasons but who are a firm part of the village community.

Most years I am able to decorate the harvest table with trails of red leaves from the Virginia creeper which grows in profusion up my trees and over walls. Some years, the leaves have coloured so early that a brisk wind strips them away leaving only stalks. But this year all the leaves are still green because, I assume, of the lack of sunlight. Strangely, lack of sun doesn't seem to have affected some things but possibly only those needing sunlight to ripen. Other things, such as runner beans and buddleia, have finished long before their usual time. Above average temperatures and excessive rain seem to have suited many things.



Farmers must find it increasingly hard to adjust to the changing climate – not even a reliable change but constantly varying from drought to floods, after at the wrong times for germination and pollinisation. But when one considers some of the terrible conditions which other countries have suffered – fires, floods and famines – our disasters are minor by comparison. In this time of harvest, we must be grateful for whatever food growers and producers can provide for us and make allowances for price increases if things cost a bit more than expected. Not always easy, especially as many of us have lost our expected winter fuel allowances.

I had a lovely surprise today which cheered me considerably. A good friend had noted my bemoaning the dearth of grasshoppers in last month's "jottings", called round with a beautiful picture of a green grasshopper which had landed on her leg while she was in her field in Chantry. I might be tempted to wander up there while this fine weather lasts to see if I can see - or hear - one. I had a less pleasant surprise a couple of weeks ago when my beloved cavalier, Ebbie, ate a £5.00 note. Although trained to bring me anything dropped on the ground in exchange for a small treat, evidently money was too great a temptation. It was gone before I realised I had dropped it. Careful searching revealed the only conclusion, Ebbie had eaten it. A hasty enquiry to the vet assured me that it wouldn't cause any blockage, but it was suggested that I might care to "watch both ends" for a few days to make sure all was proceeding normally. Sure enough, on the third day the £5.00 note arrived, neatly rolled, intact but entirely devoid of any printing or colour. A clear case of

money laundering! Obviously, a dog with expensive tastes. I suppose I should be grateful it was a £20.00 note! Once again, I have wandered from the churchyard which at this time of the year looks particularly beautiful. The summer "wilded" area has now been mowed several times (hopefully scattering the wildflower seeds) and the whole area looks larger and very green as the frequent rain has kept the grass growing. Even the huge old conker tree has hardly begun to don its autumn tints and most of the rest of the trees and shrubs are evergreen and green and serene describes it well at this time. I have written this sitting out in the sun in my stable yard, enjoying the promised gift of a few days of late summer – in autumn! Probably by the time this comes to print we shall be back to rain and grey skies but meanwhile I am enjoying this summer blessing. See you in November. Hazell


Repair work on our village hall continues, and assistance from villagers is always welcome. Here Sally, Jean and Jim apply primer paint to new plaster work.

ROY HEWETT, DECEMBER 29TH 1929 - JULY 12TH 2024

A special service to commemorate the life of Roy Scrymgeour Graham Hewett was held on Thursday August 29th at St. Andrew's Church, Mells.

Fr. Clive Fairclough returned to take the service, Zeb Baker-Smith was organist, and Roy's daughter, Kate, paid a loving and humorous tribute to her father. Hymns were *How great* Thou Art, We plough the fields, Eternal Father, strong to save, and I vow to thee, my country. A passage from Ecclesiastes was read by Roy's son, Nick. His grandson, Giles Harwood, read The Sailing Ship (What is dying?) Grandson Joe Hewett, read All is Well, and granddaughter Rebecca Watkins read Crossing the Bar. Roy was a keen and adventurous sailor. Deciding upon a career in agriculture he enrolled at Wye College, where he met Shirley, and later. after they were married, they eventually settled in Mells, taking up the tenancy of Clavey's Farm, in 1963. A truly hospitable couple they held memorable parties at Clavey's and were very involved in community life in addition to their many commitments further afield. Roy was Chairman of Mells Parish Council, Chair of Mendip District Council, a local Magistrate between 1972 and 1999, and High Sheriff of Somerset 1995-1996.

He and Shirley farmed at Clavey's until retiring in 2000, when they moved to live near Castle Cary. Shirley passed away in May 2022, very much missed by Roy and the family, and Roy continued to stay near Castle Cary, supported by his loving family, until his death In July this year. He will be very greatly missed by Kate, Bridget and Nick, and their families. Our thoughts and prayers are with them all at this time. May you rest in peace, Roy.




